#### Leadership and contribution to the early career of excellent researchers

The research assistants I advised through research projects I have been involved in have been placed in high quality PhD programs (e.g., Bazurli is a PhD candidate in Political Science and Sociology at the Scuola Normale Superiore, Florence; Novaro recently obtained a post-doc post at the Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna of Pisa, Guerrazzi obtained her PhD in Healthcare Management at the University of Alabama at Birmingham and she is assistant professor at Widener University).

The post-doc researcher I supervised is currently Senior Lecturer at the Business School of the University of Edinburgh and she is one of my co-author (Cucciniello).

As Director of the Public Management and Policy Department and now as Director of Research for Government at SDA Bocconi I have supervised the junior faculty members counseling them on their research interests and career development. Some of these young faculty members were placed in Ph D programs (e.g. Tantardini got his Ph D from Florida International University and he is now Assistant Professor of Public Administration at Penn State). In addition, to enhance their international scientific exposure I have been organizing research workshops with senior scholars and journal editors. The latest workshop has been held this past January (Jan. 10th-13th 2018) when I hosted about 30 scholars from Europe, North America and South Korea in the field of public administration and policy discussing their research projects and latest papers to exchange views and explore research collaboration opportunities. In January 2019 I organized and hosted the PUBSIC conference in Milano which was attended by over 100 scholars focusing on public sector innovation. Ph D candidates from the Bocconi Ph D program in Public Policy and Administrations where I teach were also invited to discuss their works.

#### Institutional roles and responsibilities

I am currently the Director of Research for Government at SDA Bocconi School of Management at Bocconi University. In this role, I have the responsibility for leading the research strategy on public administration, policy and management of the School. I work closely with the faculty and the Dean and Associate Deans, and I play a central role in the strategic development of research opportunities for the faculty. I recently established a panel of Italian public managers to conduct survey experiments on various topics. This is also going to be beneficial for this proposal. To set up the panel I take advantage of the community of more than 5000 public and non-profit managers that are affiliated with the School for executive education purposes. Between 2012 and 2016 I served as Director of the Department of Public Management and Policy of SDA Bocconi. In that role, I was in charge of the faculty development (about 65 FTE members including Tenured and Clinical professors) and a network of about 80 experts. I have also been in charge of re-designing the post-graduate and executive education programs shifting from a domestic offer to an international one. This meant new hiring, re-locating faculty members who were not proficient in English; supervising benchmark initiatives to design new programs as the Master of Arts Management and Administration; the Master of Public Administration and the Executive Master of Management of International Organizations (EMMIO). Lastly, as part of my role I have been in charge of drafting partnerships with governments (e.g. the Academy of Public Administration of the Republic of Kazakhstan, the Korean Development Institute School of Public Policy and Management, the Georgian Institute of Public Administration) and international organizations (e.g. the United Nations Staff System College - UNSSC and the International Training Center of the International Labor Organizations - ITC-ILO, our co-founding partners of EMMIO; the United Nations Population Fund -UNFPA).

Lastly, for the past four years I served as member of Joint Committee evaluating the programs of the Bocconi Graduate School, and I was appointed by the Rector of Bocconi University as coordinator of the Bocconi for Digital Public Administration Award. It is a competition (with monetary prize of 35,000) open to university students from all universities from around the world interested in solving public administration wicked problems though digital transformation. The competition is still on going, we received 42 projects, involving 129 students and 16 universities from 6 countries.

I have been designing and launching the Master of Science in Cyber Risk Strategy and Governance jointly with

the Polytechnic of Milano. This is the first joint program Bocconi University launches. I have involved in the planning and design of the program; the drafting of the required documents for submitting the program for approval to the Ministry of Higher Education in Italy. In addition, I have been meeting with potential donors to offer scholarship and research funds for the program. The program was launched in September 2019 with 18 full tuition scholarship dedicated to participants to the program.

### Research and advisory projects

I carry out several scientific, applied research and advisory projects in the field of digital transformation of public services, cybersecurity, change management and capacity building for governments with Italian and European institutions. In my capacity I coordinate the project as principal investigator, I design the study and coordinate data collection and reporting. I actively

support institutions in needs assessment for digital transformation and cybersecurity, to set up their strategy and to implement actions in line with their goals. I also support the evaluation processes.
